As part of the 2016-2017 season, NEPACMS will also be hosting a chamber music workshop in February 2017 with violinist Daniel Andai, concertmaster of the Miami Symphony Orchestra and artistic director of the Killington Music Festival. The workshop is open to all instruments, especially string players, and also includes rehearsing and performing in the chamber orchestra conducted by Dr. Andai. Flyers are disseminated to area teachers, band and orchestra directors, and schools for applications from music students in the Northeastern Pennsylvania region.






