Letter from the Executive Director



Dear Patrons, Board Members, and Friends of NEPACMS,

2019 was another successful year for the Northeastern Pennsylvania Chamber Music Society. The new year began with our first ever benefit at the Hayfield House on the campus of Penn State Wilkes-Barre, featuring music by Dvořák, Kodály, and Schumann. Also on the program was a work by pianist, composer, and friend to NEPACMS, Hwaen Ch'uqi.

After having to be rescheduled due to weather, February 16 featured music by contemporary composer, Baljinder Sekhon. Guest artists Joseph Murphy, Matthew Slotkin, and Eun-Joo Kwak performed three pieces by Sekhon. Rounding out the program was the Violin Sonata by famed American composer Aaron

Copland, played by Eun-Joo Kwak and myself.

Concerts in March and May brought musical guests from Georgia, New York, and Massachusetts. In March, award winning Israeli violinist Boris Abromov joined the stage with Amy Iwazumi and myself to present duo and trios in a widely varied program of music from Prokofiev to Mozart and in between. In May we were delighted to feature the double bass/cello ensemble, Duo Cello e Basso. The first half of the program featured selections from their repertoire followed by the lush Vaughn-Williams Piano Quintet, a relatively early work by Ralph Vaughn-Williams for piano, violin, viola, cello, and double-bass. Joining on piano was Hwaen Ch'uqi.

The last concert of the calendar year and the first to kick off the 2019/2020 season was a program of chamber works for organ and strings. Organist, Mark Laubach, performing on St. Stephen's beautiful Austin and Aeolian-Skinner pipe organ rebuilt by the Berghaus Organ Company of Chicago in 2008 joined Amy Iwazumi, Christiane Appenheimer-Vaida, and myself for a concert of rarely performed works.

2019 also saw the addition of a new board member. We welcome Clair Sever to the board of NEPACMS and thank her for her contributions. Her love of music and commitment to NEPACMS' vision will be invaluable for us in the coming months and year.

Thank you to everyone that has donated, volunteered, and otherwise helped make 2019 another successful year for NEPACMS. We look forward to seeing you in 2020and beyond!
