Letter from the Executive Director



Dear Patrons, Board Members, and Friends of NEPACMS,

2020 was without a doubt a trying year for arts organizations throughout the United States. NEPACMS was no exception. Although we were not able to share in person concerts for almost a year and a half, we used the pandemic as an opportunity to be creative in the way we fulfill our mission.

In the fall of 2020 NEPACMS launched its Music Matters series, a series of carefully curated conversations and workshops exploring matters in music and why it matters. We brought guests such as Nancy Sanderson, Executive Director

of the NEPA Philharmonic, legendary double-bassist and faculty at the Eastman School of Music, James VanDemark, and Broadway musician and clarinetist, Nuno Antunes, as well as others to what turned out to be a wildly successful set of programs. Connecting via Zoom we had participants sign up from across the country.

Of course we could not let an entire season pass us by without chamber music! In addition to our Music Matters series we presented several pre-recorded concerts with Amy Iwazumi, Chief of Operations, and myself playing violin and viola. Joining us for a program of trios by Jongen and Brahms was NEPACMS board member Rick Hoffenberg on piano.

With the country opening up we are getting back to bringing live in-person chamber music performances to the Northeastern Pennsylvania community. We look forward to seeing you (although still masked for at least the near future) at one of our upcoming performances.

15 Minutes to a Better Left Hand October 3, 2020

Dr. Theodore Buchholz, cello professor and head of strings at University of Arizona, performer, and a nationally recognized researcher, gives an interactive session exploring creative strategies for forming a fifteen-minute regiment designed to develop or enhance a highly effective left hand. Within this fifteen-minute workout a wide array of technical ideas is covered including left hand set up, intonation, ear-to-hand coordination, efficiency, relaxation, coordination, shifting, and vibrato.

Broken Bows

November 14, 2020

John Vaida explores a methodical approach to bow division and its artistic application to repertoire. Exercises and repertoire have been selected for use on any bowed string instrument. Study how bow distribution can develop a focused sustained tone, build rhythmic accuracy, fulfill musical conception, and lead to artistic freedom.
