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Letter from the Executive Director



Dear Patrons, Board Members, and Friends of NEPACMS,

2021 was another trying year for arts organizations but also one filled with hope. Here at NEPACMS we have been committed to our mission of fostering the growth of chamber music in our area, no matter what the circumstances, venue, or medium.

The first half of the season was filled with inspiring online sessions under the title Music Matters, beginning with a conversation with Northeastern Pennsylvania Philharmonic, Executive Director, Nancy Sanderson. We talked about everything from the current state of the arts in our country and region to the importance of

music education programs. In February, I was joined by my wife and co-founder/Chief of Operations, Amy Iwazumi for an online performance of duos for violin and viola. Nuno Antunes, a NEPACMS Artist, gave a wonderful online workshop for clarinetists in March and in the same month I was joined by legendary bassist and Eastman School of Music professor, James VanDemark. Rounding out our 2021 Music Matters series was a workshop for string players by Lisa Caravan, Assistant Professor of Music Teaching and Learning at the Eastman School of Music and NEPACMS Artist.

The summer of 2021 was an especially memorable one for us. In July we presented ChamberFest, a series of two back to back concerts filled with inspirational music. This marked our first live and in-person concert since the start of the pandemic. The programming premise was simple; play music that we love and share it with all of you. The concerts featured music by Brahms, Schumann, Françaix, and Mendelssohn. Joining Amy and me onstage were two NEPACMS Artists and friends, Hwaen Ch'uqi, piano and Lisa Caravan, cello.

To finish the year, NEPACMS was proud to present Gems of the Progressive Era, a program of music from the turn of the 20th century. We played Ravel's marvelous and universally adored string quartet, as well as two pieces by American composer Amy Beach. Her Romance for violin and piano and Piano Quintet stole the show!

Thank you to all of you who are as dedicated as we are to ensuring that chamber music thrives in the Northeastern Pennsylvania region for years to come. We look forward to many more seasons of presenting live world class chamber music programs to inspire you and generations to come.
